The scholarship is open to any high school senior in Franklin County with a GPA of 2.7 or above. The scholarship is not available to family of staff or volunteers at Expree.

An impartial committee comprised of Expree volunteers and employees will select the recipient. The scholarship will be awarded in \$500 increments over the course of the student's


