The member was terrified she would not qualify for a loan with Expree and felt she needed to apologize for "wasting time" before the loan officer even started. e check she was about to cash had a loan interest rate of 36%. is member was on disability but lived well within her means, paid her bills and had a credit score of 636. Expree was not only able to get her a loan for the money she needed but was able to lower her rate to 16.5% with a payment below \$100 a month.


